

**1. Background:**

British Council, the United Kingdom's international organisation for cultural relations and educational opportunities for the people of the UK and other countries and builds trust between them worldwide. We are on the ground in six continents and over 100 countries bringing international opportunity to life, every day. Each year we work with millions of people, connecting them with the United Kingdom, sharing our cultures and the UK's most attractive assets: English, the Arts, Education and our ways of living and organising society. We have 80 years' experience of doing this.

**Promoting Democratic Inclusion and Governance through Youth (PRODIGY)** is a British Council's Society project which aims to increase peaceful civic participation in local governance in Bangladesh by empowering youth.

Working in 13 Union Parishad (UP) and 2 Pourashava since 2014, PRODIGY has developed the knowledge and skills of 540 young people to engage the wider community through volunteer activities, including youth club activities, theatre performances, internships with local government, community radio programs and public dialogues, creating platforms and channels to ensure that the wider community has access to government information. These 540 young people (aged 18 to 30, 50% female) have been given the skills to assess whether local government bodies are fulfilling their commitments and responding to citizens' needs. Stressing the need for social inclusivity and equal participation, the focus in PRODIGY is on women, the poor and marginalised groups.

The trained 540 young people have initiated 75 innovative and creative Social Action Projects (SAPs) in local communities to ensure that marginalized communities receive the information and guidance that they need to ensure their participation in local government's activities, and contribution to, social change.

These 540 young people of PRODIGY have been promoting civic participation in local governance and advocating the principles of integrity, accountability, transparency, inclusivity at the heart of good governance in its focus areas of 15 Union Parishad (rural) and Pourashava (urban) across 3 divisions (Dhaka, Khulna and Rajshahi) in Bangladesh.

The three strands of PRODIGY are:

- **Knowledge Development in Accountability, Transparency and Inclusivity** This includes the identification of 540 youths across 3 Divisions who have been trained and acting as agents for positive social change. Building on current learning and experience in this field, consortium partners have reviewed and refined existing training modules. Master trainers were

selected and trained by consortium partners' experts in youth development, local governance and rights issues. PRODIGY has developed the capacity of 540 young social activists through 3 phases of training on-

- Training on Youth Leadership
  - Training on Transparency, Accountability, Inclusivity and Good Governance
  - Training on Grant management
- **Community Engagement** PRODIGY staffs have assisted the 540 youth leaders to design, plan and implement their community based Social Action Projects (SAPs), advised on outreach to local communities, and ensure the engagement of local government authorities. Continuous mentoring and monitoring and evaluation were done during this period to ensure proper implementation of the SAPs. The key objective of the SAPs was to increase peaceful civic participation in all possible way in different activities of local government. Also some of the SAPs aim to create awareness among community people on basic civic-rights which ultimately led them to demand more accountability, transparency and inclusivity from the local government.
  - **Recognition and Demonstration of Positive Youth Engagement** National Youth Summit, held in Dhaka and International Youth Days were held in all 15 areas of PRODIGY implementation which generated wide publicity and reach.

## **2. Evaluation purpose and objectives:**

The key objectives for this proposed evaluation are

- to assess the progress made towards each project goal of PRODIGY based on the current logic model (Annex 1), design and monitoring plan (Annex B).
- to determine the strengths (including successful innovations and practices) and weakness (factors impeding progress) of the programme planning, design, implementation and ongoing community engagement initiatives by PRODIGY youth leaders through Social Action Projects

This evaluation also needs to explore the answers of the following questions-

- **Relevance of the project:**
  - What value did PRODIGY add to its context that community people are not aware of their rights or the services which they should be ideally be provided by the local government;
- **Inclusion:**
  - To determine how the programme involved and benefitted women, and other marginalised group (such as people with disability, ethnic or religious minority, extreme poor) throughout the planning, design, implementation of the project;

- **Effectiveness of the project:**
  - To what extent the planned output (as per the project logic model) led to the achievements of the outcomes
  - Are there any difference at the achievement level between the grant awarded SAPs and the SAPs with no grant award<sup>1</sup>
- **Innovation of the project:**
  - How the Internship programme <sup>2</sup>of PRODIGY project is benefitting the Interns as well as the local government offices
- **Impact of the project:**
  - What percentage (%) of the targeted citizens in the targeted areas are motivated through PRODIGY interventions and actively participate in local governance, leading to increase civic participation
  - What percentage (%) of the targeted citizens, particularly women from poor and marginalised groups, in the targeted areas are aware of their rights
- **Ownership and sustainability of the project**
  - How many young people and their networks in the targeted areas are inspired through PRODIYG interventions to take up similar initiatives

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<sup>1</sup> PRODIGY youth leaders have initiated 75 Social Action Projects at the community level. Based on the merit of the projects, 45 Social Action Projects have been awarded with small grant. The rest 35 Social Action Projects are also running by the PRODIGY youth leaders without grant support.

<sup>2</sup> Internship programme is one of the innovative interventions of PRODIGY. Under this programme, 15 PRODIGY youth leaders (1 in each project location) have been placed as Intern in the local government office.

### **3. Scope of work:**

PRODIGY has been running in 15 areas (13 Union Parishad and 02 Pourashava) under 8 Upozilas in 5 Districts including Dhaka, Rajshahi, Chuadanga, Shatkhira, Khulna. The list below describes the detail work area of PRODIGY-

All the project areas (15) should be covered under this evaluation. In each area, a total number of 36 PRODIGY youth leaders received 3 phases of trainings, and then 36 youth leaders have been divided into 5 groups. Each group has initiated one Social Action Project. This means, PRODIGY youth leaders are running 5 Social Action Projects in each area. 3 Social Action Projects out of 5 have been awarded with small grant in each area. So there are total 75 Social Action Projects are running in 15 project areas, among them 45 projects have been awarded, and 30 projects have been not.

This evaluation should study at least 1 grant awarded Social Action Project, which can be randomly chosen, from each project location to answer the evaluation questions. Also it is recommended that this evaluation should also study at least 1 non-awarded Social Action Project from at least 5 project locations to evaluate the difference of achievement/result between grant awarded SAPs and non-awarded SAPs.

### **3.1 Activities and Approaches**

In performing the assignment, the consultant shall conduct the following activities;

- Attend a project brief which will be arranged by the PRODIGY management team of British Council to gain further clarification on the evaluation objectives

- Production and submission of an Inception Report which includes a detail work plan, key activities and tools in carrying out/delivering the project deliverables
- Collecting all data as per the methodology mentioned in the inception report to meet the research objectives and to prepare the first draft evaluation report. It is expected that the consultant will do survey for PRODIGY youth leaders and SAP beneficiaries, have some FGDs with PRODIGY leaders and SAP beneficiaries to validate/supplement the findings of the survey, interview with local government representatives in the targeted areas, interview the project staffs, interview the Interns and office secretaries or respective Chairman of local government who supervise the Interns.
- Drafting of the initial evaluation report and presentation to the PRODIGY management team in the British Council for validation and feedback prior to finalisation
- Completion and submission of the final report
